



Undergraduate students at Fordham University are invited to apply for Summer School at the University of Pretoria for the period of 27 July – 14 August 2015.

Two modules are offered, one in Church History and one in Practical Theology. Each module carries 7 South African academic credits (the equivalent of 1.5 academic credits at Fordham).

Applicants are responsible for airfare and accommodation (accommodation will be approximately \$51 per night per person sharing and is inclusive of dinner, bed and breakfast). Applicants are also responsible for the levy and international registration (\$450) and transport costs of various site visits (\$100). The logistical aspects in South Africa will be dealt with by the Faculty of Theology.

- An on-going quest for an urban public theology

Mobile classrooms will be included in the module, including

- a neighbourhood and ministry tour of inner-city Pretoria/Tshwane and surrounding areas
- exposure to diverse faith response to the urban challenges of Johannesburg

At the end of each module, each student will develop a final essay in consultation with a supervisor at the University of Pretoria; these final essays will be due at the end of September.
